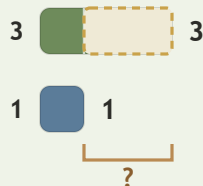
Compare Within 10 • Model

DO THIS Build the bars. Find how many more.

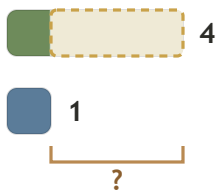
MODEL A longer bar means more.

EXAMPLE



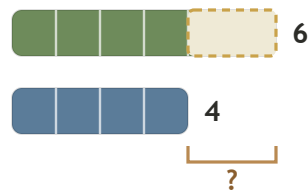

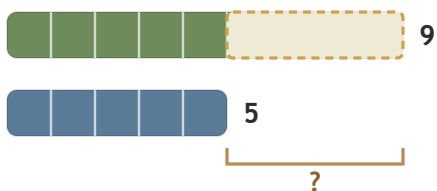

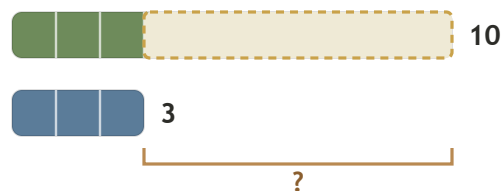
$$6 - 4 = \boxed{} \text{ more}$$

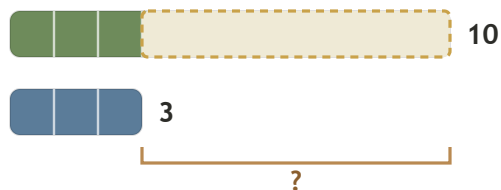
$$6 - 4 = \underline{2} \text{ more}$$
