Doubles & Sums to 20

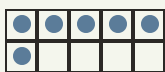
Objective: Add small numbers. Learn your doubles so you just know them.

INSTRUCTION

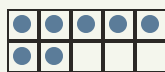
Count both groups, then write how many in all. Learn your doubles so you just know them!

EXAMPLE

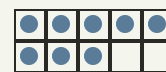
A double is a number added to itself.



$$3 + 3 = 6$$



$$5 + 2 = 7$$



$$4 + 4 = 8$$

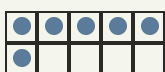
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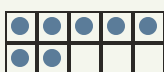
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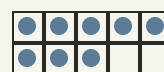
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
