rule: Include comma before 'and' in a series of three items

rule: Use colon before listing items introduced by main clause

She worked hard on the project which was due Friday, so she finished it on time.

She worked hard on the project, which was due Friday, so she finished it on time.

rule: Use commas around 'which' clauses that provide extra information

The children learned three important lessons sharing, honesty, and patience.

The children learned three important lessons: sharing, honesty, and patience.

rule: Use colon before a list that follows a complete thought
