She looked around the fair and saw Sophie standing near the refreshment table. Sophie's eyes were wide, and she looked scared. Just then, a boy Maya didn't know very well came walking over. - 6 Maya's heart hurt. Her project was ruined. All her hard work was destroyed. She looked at the boy, then at Sophie. Sophie was walking toward her, and there were tears in her eyes too. "Maya, I'm sorry," Sophie said. "When I saw what happened, I wanted to tell you, but I was scared the boy would get in trouble. I didn't know how to help. I feel terrible."
- 7 Maya stood there, feeling angry and sad. But then she thought about something her grandmother had told her. "When someone makes a mistake, you can choose to be angry, or you can choose to help them feel better," her grandmother had said. "Forgiveness is powerful." Maya took a deep breath. She looked at the boy. "It was an accident. You didn't mean to. Thank you for being honest about it." The boy looked relieved. "I'm really sorry," he said again.
- 8 Then Maya looked at Sophie. "I understand why you were scared. We all make mistakes sometimes. I'm not angry at you." Sophie hugged her. "Thank you for forgiving me. That means so much. And I'm going to help you fix your project right now if I can."
- 9 Together, Maya, Sophie, and the boy worked to clean up the water cycle model. They couldn't fix everything, but they made it better. When the judge came by, Maya explained what happened. The judge was impressed by how Maya had handled the mistake. "You showed real courage and kindness," the judge told Maya. "That's worth more than any perfect project."
- 10 Maya didn't win a prize that day, but she learned something more important. She learned that forgiving people and helping them fix their mistakes was better than staying angry.
