Objective: *Join two groups to make a whole.*

DO THIS Put the groups together. Count them all.

DISCOVER Joining makes more.

EXAMPLE



Join the groups.

$$2 + 6 = \underline{8}$$

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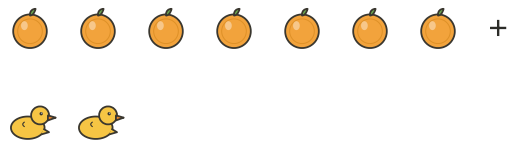
JOIN AND COUNT How many?

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$$4 + 2 = \underline{6}$$

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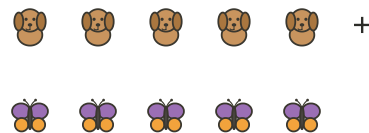
$$7 + 2 = \underline{9}$$
